WE'VE BROKEN DOWN THE REGISTRATION PROCESS INTO THESE KEY STEPS

1 REGISTER FOR THE FESTIVAL | JANUARY 14, 2026

Mail Registration Form and Cheque for Registration Fee to NBTA Drama Festival by January 14th

To register, complete the Registration Form on the last page and mail to the NBTA Drama Festival with a cheque for the registration fee. **The cheque must accompany the registration.** Each school can bring one, two, or three plays, based on scheduling availability. The registration form allows you to select your preferred time slots. Time slots are given priority based on the order when registrations are received. Information for the program will be submitted separately and is due by April 15th. Late registrations will only be accepted pending scheduling availability. After January 14th, the fee is \$125/play. **Payment for individual participants is \$25 per person.** This includes students and chaperones and is due when you arrive at the Festival.

2 SUBMIT POSTER DESIGNS | JANUARY 28, 2026

Please pass along "Information for Art Teachers" (pages 5 & 6) to the appropriate person in your school.

Every year we ask the students of the province to submit a design for our logo. The chosen design will be on our poster and the student artist will be given \$200. We have developed a gallery of art from past submissions that are displayed at the Festival. We add to this each year.

3 BOOK ACCOMMODATIONS | APRIL 6, 2026

Accommodations are booked directly with STU, UNB, or hotels and not through the Festival.

The Drama Festival Committee is not responsible for accommodations. These arrangements are made between the school and the universities. We contact the Residence Offices and they set deadlines and we communicate those to the schools.

Most schools choose to stay at the St. Thomas University Dorms. This is very convenient as two of the three theatres that we use are on the St. Thomas campus. If you want to stay at St. Thomas, you must book your accommodations by April 6th. Their housing office may be contacted by email at residencelife@stu.ca or by phone at 506-453-7213.

Some schools have chosen to stay on the UNB campus. Their housing office may be contacted by email meet@unb.ca or by phone at 506-453-5010.

Other schools have chosen to stay at local hotels and walk to the campus.

4 SUBMIT PROGRAM INFORMATION | APRIL 15, 2026

Everyone gets a program, make sure your play's information is included.

Registered schools will be contacted with more details on how to provide their information for the program. This information, which includes cast, crew, production team, and synopsis of play, will be placed directly in the program **based on what you submit.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

LANGUAGE AND MATERIAL

- Your play must be appropriate for an event that is sponsored by the Department of Education and the NBTA. If you would not do the play at your school in front of the student body and your administration, then it cannot be done at the festival. You must consider language, appropriate material, and cultural sensitivity.
- Offensive language and inappropriate material are not acceptable and may result in disqualification from recognition.

ELIGIBILITY

- All public New Brunswick Middle and High Schools are eligible to enter the festival.
- Productions may be directed by teachers, student teachers, students, or a community volunteer approved by the school administration.
- Individual directors may direct two plays.
- All participants must be registered students in your school.
- Teachers may not appear in a play or do voiceovers.

NUMBER OF PLAYS AND SCHEDULING

- Middle Schools may register a maximum of three plays.
- High Schools may register a maximum of three plays.
- The first two plays will be registered on a first received-first registered basis.
- Third plays will be scheduled at Memorial Hall, UNB for the High School Festival.

TIME

- To be eligible for recognition, each production must be over 25 minutes and no longer than 60 minutes.
- Each play has **20 minutes to set up and 10 minutes to strike.** There will be an official timer for each of these elements. These times will be posted so that directors, cast, and crew will be aware of any problems before the Recognition Ceremony.
- If the play does not comply with the time regulations, it will be disqualified from all categories of recognition except acting.
- The play begins when the lights come up, a line is spoken, or music is played. If there is any dispute, the posted time will be considered accurate. Remember that the festival audience is usually very enthusiastic, so please factor this into your playing time.



FESTIVAL THEATRES

At the New Brunswick Drama Festival we are fortunate to have access to three theatres in one location. Each has unique features that you might want to consider before you make a choice on your registration form.

THE BLACK BOX

The Black Box is a studio space with flexible seating. There is a centre entrance as well as entrances on stage right and left. It is an appropriate venue for larger groups. Floor work is difficult to see in this venue. The theatre has an excellent loading facility, dressing rooms, effective lighting and sound. There is a follow spot available.

TED DAIGLE THEATRE

The Ted Daigle is a small traditional theatre. The stage is relatively small and the audience is very close to the action. The loading facility is excellent, dressing rooms are adequate, and lighting and sound are effective. If you need a follow spot, please make a separate request the week before the festival.

MEMORIAL HALL AT UNB

This venue was generously added by UNB for the High School level. It is a traditional theatre with an elevated stage. There is a circular staircase that provides access to the dressing room. The lighting and sound are effective. The loading is through the house using double doors that are 6 feet wide and 7 feet tall. This playing space is used for third plays for the **High School Division.**


